

Hydrangea paniculata

Cultivar	Flower Notes	Foliage & Habit
Angel Blush/Ruby	A seedling of Pink Diamond with white sepals deepening to pink and deeper colors later in the season.	
Grandiflora/Pee Gee	Large panicles of white, primarily sterile, flowers with sepals that age to pink and purple-pink. Blooming peaks in July and remains effective to early September.	8-10' tall. Flower size depends on pruning and plant vigor. Plants left to their own devices have smaller flowers.
Kyushu	Panicles are mixed with fertile and sterile flowers. The number of ray flowers is limited compared to the fertile ones and the sepals are relatively small.	An upright selection.
Limelight	Bright lime-green flowers.	Weak stems produce a weeping willow effect. 6-10' high x 5-6' wide, rounded shrub, moderate grower.
Pink Diamond	Large conical inflorescences made up of fertile and showy flowers with the showy sepals turning rich pink.	Forms a large plant.
Tardiva	Late June into late August and September. Inflorescences are a mixture of fertile and sterile flowers. Sepals turn pinkish.	
Unique	Large, pure white, sterile florets and rounded sepals. The showy sepals almost completely conceal the fertile flowers. Late flowering, approximately mid-July.	10-14' high.
